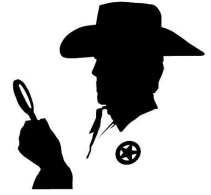

This hands-on course begins with instruction in the use of the digital camera equipment, focusing on manual modes, manual adjustments, and low light photography. The student then receives comprehensive instruction and practical application in the forensic application of Ultra-Violet and Infrared Photography to the crime scene investigation process. This class features the Fuji XT1-IR digital camera. The camera kit and required accessories are provided for use in the class. The program utilizes extensive practical exercises with the camera to build a student skill set in photographing Latent Fingerprints, Gunshot Residue, Bloodstains, Bodily Fluids, Forged Documents, Bruises and Bite Mark Evidence. **PREREQUISITE:** Basic skills with the digital SLR camera.
